Debbie Ponis Kuhn Superior Performance



Debbie Kuhn, formerly Debbie Ponis, began her bowling career at the ripe old age of 5. "My dad would take me to Fair Lanes Dundalk where he would bowl for 5 minutes and I would bowl for 2 hours" she confesses. Little did they realize that these Saturday morning father and daughter outings would blossom into a love for the sport and would one day send Debbie around the world representing the United States in international competition.

Coming up through the youth program in the Saturday morning leagues andlater the Sunday morning travel league, Debbie collected her share of patches,

league championships and individual awards. During these early years it was not apparent of the achievements that lay ahead One trait the youth program brought out in Debbie was her competitive spirit "I remember that after our leagues were over, Danny Wiseman and I would bowl matches for sodas", she says. I think I was 14 or 15 and he was 11 or 12. "He would be throwing his Columbia Yellow Dot and I had a Marvin's Sport City Blue Gem". My dad would take me down on Mondays' to watch the First Niters and I really liked the way the men hooked the ball and decided that I didn't want to throw the ball like a girl "I wanted to Hook it" She began to accomplish this by only inserting her thumb halfway into her conventional grip. "It did not hook a lot, but I was not backing it up like the other girls", she says.

After Debbie graduated from high school, she entered Essex Com- munity College and the adult leagues. While in College Debbie won the Region XX doubles, with her partner and friend Judy West, and

won the All Events. She finished 2nd in doubles, again with Judy West, and 3rd in All Events at the NJCAA National Tournament in 1982 and was named to the NJCAA All American Team. During this time Debbie was being coached local standout Don Conners. Don was like a second father to me she admits. He made me feel comfortable. Don was the first of only a few coaches that I have had, but he was the one who started me. I worked with Don until about 1985 and accomplished quite a bit

Debbie took a break from bowling for about 3years. She back in 1988 with a mission. That mission was to be the best she could possibly be. In steps Mike Lastowski. Debbie had been working with Don and he suggested that Mike take her to the next level Don of course was right Debbie has worked with Mike since 1988 and most recently Team USA coach Shawn Klug. With their help she has accomplished more than he imagined

Debbie has been a member of the BWBA and MSWBA for 16 years During those 16 years she has won 38 local city, state, regional, national, and international association titles. She has been named to 3 All American Teams and been featured in various bowling magazines. She has a high average of 209, high set of 774 and (1) 300 game. She has averaged 200 or better 10 of those years. Debbie established 3 WIBC Tournament records in 1991. She was the FIRST Woman ever to bowl 2000 or better for the 9 game All Events at the WIBC Tournament Her 2036 for 9 games included a series of 773 in the singles Event The 773 series is THE highest 3 game series EVER bowled at the WIBC Tournament as well as the highest series in singles.
