to win the tournament and his bowling career had begun.

That fall Brian also started working in Barry Warshafsky's Winners Circle Pro Shop and Stadium 10 Pin in Manchester NH. From there, Brunswick Recreation Centers offered him a job in the management development program. Brian managed bowling centers up and down the east coast from 1990-1996.

In 2003, while living in Lewes, Delaware Brian met his future wife, Angel at Millsboro Lanes while bowling a summer league. They eventually moved to Baltimore where they are currently raising their son Cameron who has also shown a love for bowling.

Brian competed as a member of the PBA from 2002-2011 and continues to compete against top bowlers in leagues and tournaments. He booked a career best 246 league average and accumulated perfect games in 13 states as well as state and association titles in 5 states. He continues to work in the bowling industry, currently operating Outrageous Business Pro Shop in Hyattsville, MD.
