Chloé Danielle Franicevich 19 is the daughter of James and Jessica Franicevich from Aberdeen, Maryland. She fell in love bowling at an early age when she placed her first “Tinkerbell” ball down the old metal ramp on her 5th birthday at Arctic Lanes in Fairbanks, Alaska. Her Army Family moved down to Saint Robert, Missouri where she joined her first USBC sanctioned league at the age of 6 and has been a sanctioned youth bowler every year since. As a military child, traveling around the country has allowed her the ability to bowl in sanctioned leagues across 3 different states: Missouri, Hawaii, and Maryland. She has been a member of the Cecil-Harford Bowling association since she arrived in 2013 and Baltimore County since 2017.

Chloe is a Class of 2020 graduate from Harford Technical School in Bel Air, Maryland. She was a terrific student who made honor roll during her time in both middle and high school where she always received accolades for her behavior towards teachers and fellow students. She applied to Harford Tech’s Animal Science Program and was a member of the Future Farmers of America Organization where she competed in FFA competitions. She was a Cecil-Harford Youth board member for one year and has volunteered her time with multiple organizations. Her and her family spent time with Operation Homefront handing out backpacks to local children at the Aberdeen VFW and she volunteered with her mom at Aberdeen Family Dental where she performed as a dental assistant helping to provide free dental work to the community.

Upon arrival in Maryland, she signed up for the APG Shooting Stars youth league at Aberdeen Proving Ground. During her first year she led her team to 1st place finish, while achieving the top average in the girl's division that earned her a trip to the Maryland High Average Invitational. For the next 2 seasons, Chloe would lead the Shooting Stars youth league in overall average.

For the 2017/2018 season, Chloe wanted to move to a bigger challenge and went on to bowl in 2 leagues at the Country Club Lanes Friday Night Sport Youth Challenge and Forest Hill Lanes Saturday Youth League. Chloe would hold the Top Female Average at the Forrest Hill Lanes Saturday Morning Youth league for the 2019 and 2020 seasons.

Chloe, has bowled in numerous local, regional and state tournaments including: State High Average, the Cecil-Harford, Maryland State, and Pepsi every year since 2014. In 2014 she won her first singles event in the Aberdeen Proving Grounds Youth King of the Hill tournament. In 2015, she finished in 2nd place at the Danny Wiseman Youth Scholarship tournament and 4th place in 2016. In 2017 Maryland State Tournament she placed first in the Doubles and All-Events Handicap division. During that same year she qualified second at the Pepsi regional qualifier and earned her place into the state tournament. At the Maryland Pepsi State Tournament, she walked the stepladder from 4th place to win the Title in the U15 girls division. After being slowed down in 2018 by a medical procedure Chloe came back strong during the 2019 season and place first in the Cecil-Harford Youth Tournament in the Handicap Singles, All-Events Handicap, and All-Events Scratch divisions.

She has also bowled in major national and out of state tournaments. In 2017, Chloe competed at the Teen Masters tournament held in Richmond, Virginia and at Junior Gold Cleveland, Ohio. In 2018, she qualified and competed in the Junior Gold Tournament held in Dallas, Texas.
