Bradley Brodeur is from Easton, Maryland and was born on March 24, 2007. He is the youngest child born to Phil and Liz Brodeur. He is currently a junior in High School.

Bradley has been bowling since age 4 after being introduced to bowling by his dad. Easton Bowl is his home center, but Bradley has also bowled leagues in Chop tank Bowling & Billiards in Cambridge, MD, and Mid-County Lanes in Middletown, DE.

Bradley has participated in numerous tournaments over the years, most recently placing 1st doubles and 2nd in all events in the 2023 Eastern Shore USBC Youth Open. In December, 2022 Bradley earned his first spot in the Junior Gold Championships, traveling to Indianapolis in July 2023. While he did not advance to the finals, Bradley placed 375 out of 1313 bowlers in his division. While in Indianapolis, Bradley also participated in a qualifier for the 2024 Junior Gold Championship tournament by placing 55 out of 354 bowlers!

Bradley has loved the sport of bowling since he started but recently took his game to the next level by attending a Ritger Legacy Bowling Camp at Greenway Bowl. Since then, Bradley's game has vastly improved – during the 2022-23 season he bowled 299 game in a Junior Gold qualifier tournament and finished the season with a career-high 206 average.

Bowling keeps Bradley busy, but he also has interests in basketball, fishing and Airsoft. He is also an active cadet in the Civil Air Control Program as a Chief Master Sergeant, at the Easton Composite Squadron.

Bradley's future include graduation from high school in 2025, attending college for business studies, and pursuing professional bowling.
